Even though school was out for the summer, Vacation Bible School (VBS) was just getting underway the week of June 26th.




Fellowship, swimming, games, and an array of picnic favorites made for a perfect way to spend a Saturday summer day.


We pray that all of the CBC youth continue to grow and flourish both spiritually and academically as they enter into a new school year.
